'Mothers' Rally Fizzles Out With Call

Vivian Kellems Caught

Flirting With Pro-Fascist Group

CHICAGO, June 14. We the Mothers, Mobilize for America, Inc., an anti-Administration, anti-Semitic Peace Now women's organization, closed its much-ballyhooed national convention in Chicago last night with resolutions demanding an immediate end of hostilities and a negotiated peace with Germany

The convention, which started Monday with about 300 women on hand, fizzled out last night after delegates drifted away, disappointed because most of the invited speakers-including Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt-failed to appear.
