Dear Mr. Goode,

You should have received the manuscript of the draft of COUP D'ETAT by the time you wrote me on 8/29. If you have not received it by the end of the day you should receive this, which should not be until Tuesday with the holiday, would you please phone and I'll have a tracer put on it. I did insure it.

If you say I have a misimpression about the expenses of the trip, I am certain you are right and my recollection is incorrect. The other expenses, however, were not related to what I then showed you. I had been asked to help Eric Norden with the piece he was doing on the "Inuitmen. I did have the material I promised for him, I did phone him several times, he did make several dates to come here and didn't. As a matter of fact, I undoubtedly put in more time on that than I can recall.

I was to have been recompensed after Eric came here and you had a chance to evaluate what I got for that piece. Since he never came the occasion never arose. But I did have for you a number of I think pretty good things, including several inside witnesses and several "Inuitmen threats to kill JFK.

If this presents any kind of problem, I am used to forgetting them.
