## CIA to Stop Giving Aid to Local Police

The Central Intelligence gency has agreed with the hairman of the House Comlittee on Government Operaons to drop its technical asstance to local police agenes except in "compelling cirimstances."

Chairman Chet Holifield (Dalif.) made the CIA's decion public yesterday.

CIA assistance to about a pzen local police agencies pross the nation included pecialized training in street treeillance" to Montgomery ounty police and training for lstrict and Fairfax police.

Police from Arlington and , lexandria attended a demonration at CIA headquarters McLean of a substance used r detecting whether a peron has handled a metal oblet, such as a gun.

Holifield urged CIA Direcpr James R. Schlesinger Jr. to Iscontinue CIA training of leal police because the pracbe could create problems in oth training intelligence gency resources and involvng the CIA in "domestic-type ctivities contrary to the ageny's basic mission."

"Compelling circumstances" ader which the training rould be allowed might inlude investigations of interpational crime and drug trafleking, a spokesman for the overnment Operations Comtittee said.
