

Received the following information from Sgt. Jack Green of the Arlington Police Department.

Sgt. Green stated SUBJ 62 was arrested November 27, 1963 at 2:04 A.M. in Arlington, Texas for not having a rear license plate and no valid Texas Drivers license. Subj. 62 correcting officer that Attorney Tom Howard had his rear license plate in his office.

SUBJ 62 stated he was a friend of Jack Ruby for a number of years. Subj. 62 is an entertainer and has entertained in Jack Ruby's club for several years.

Attached to the original an enclosure #1 is a copy of the arrest sheet and the telephone numbers and addresses that SUBJ 62 had in his possession at time of arrest.

SUBJECT is the owner and operator of the Bill Pen, 1026 West Abrams, Arlington, Texas, CR 5 4851 and CR 5 4891.

SUBJECT stated he has known Jack Ruby for about 15 years. Stated Ruby did not have any interest in the Bill Pen. Stated he has loaned Ruby money on several occasions to pay the rent at the Carousel Club.

Stated Ruby called him about 15 minutes after the President was shot and told him he was going to close all his places for three days. Stated Ruby talked as if he was emotionally upset.

SUBJECT stated an Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation had interviewed him recently regarding Jack Ruby.
