Rights Leader Urges Vote For Humphrey

National civil rights leader Baynard Rustin said in New Orleans that Hubert H. Humphrey is the only presidential candidate who "will be able to stop young Negro people from becoming filled with rage and rioting in the streets."

The vice president, Rustin said, "is the only man who can deal with the fear in the white community."

An organizer of the 1963 march on Washington, D. C., Rustin was addressing a Humphrey rally yesterday at Local 1419, International Longshoremen's Association auditorium.

He labeled George C. Wallace "a racist," adding that "Nixon is a diluted racist. These men will not be able to calm the nerves of the white people and the black people so that we can live in one country, free of fear."

U.S. Rep. Hale Boggs was scheduled to attend the rally but his wife appeared to say that he could not come "because the time of the meeting and the Saint's football game came into conflict. He is one of the 83,000 fans today." She urged everyone to vote.

Rustin criticized the black power movement. He called it "the Klu Klux Klan in reverse. . . . Qualifications, on both sides, should be ability and dedication, not color."
