I was thirteen years old when President Kennedy was assassinated.

A couple of years later I saved up my allowance and sent for Whitewash. In those days a great many adults scoffed at my interest and belief that the Warren Commission Report held about as much water as a bottomless thimble. I put up with a great deal of criticism during those early years of independent investigation when only a tireless few such as yourself were devoting themselves to uncovering the truth, but nothing ever changed my mind.

Most of America eventually became less naive and caught up with the fact that something really was rotten in the state of Dallas. I suppose that's why Posner was recruited to start "the new lie."
