This sy shyste ing of the <u>Post</u> is far from Posner's only insistent on the lie, that the "airwell analysis work was for him. I have no ever known him to dmit the truth or to give an honest naswer when confronted with the truth about it. Neither he nor Random House has issued any retraction.

Pesner's obdurate to be honest and truthful has parhaps its most dramatic on the return match between him and Dr. Cyril Wecht, the reknowned forensic pathologist, when the CNN "Crossfire" show marked the 30th anniversary, on November 19, 1993.

This is what the transcript reflects, with Wecht speaking, on page 4:

....

What Mr. Posner weeps talking about is this computer enhancement, this simulated thing. He forgets and ignores to tell you—please, Mr. Posner, be honest with your viewers and your hosts tonight and let them know that the other scientists at the FAA who did this work, and not for you, Mr. Posner, but for the American Bar Association, to sell their wares, that one half of them at least disagreed, including the president of the corporation.

- KINSLEY: How about that?

Dr. WECHT: So don't talk about-

Mr. POSNER: No, no-

Dr. WECHT: One more point with regard to-

Mr. POSNER: Don't distort the record.

Telling the truth is to Posner distorting the record!

Posner continued to evade and even instead of responding sought to attack "echt, saying what is obviously false, "Tou're trying to attack the sources because you can't deal with the substance."

Wecht replied, "The source? You have represented that you had a special study done-" Ponser again interrupted to say, "Wait a mint minute. It's public record, and I have this-" And here Posner as saved by the miderator's interruption and changing of the subject, to the conclusions of the mock trial. Posner even lied about that, not admitting that the jury did not agree with him and his use of the prosecution side of the case of.

These digressions to save Posner continued, with Pat Buchanan pitching in to help him out. The last of his shystering on this subject, without his ever telling or admitting the truth,

is Posner's representation, shyster worded, that there was no disagreement at Failure
Analysis in its bar assassociation presentation. Buchanan did not even let him finish
