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YOUTH HOUSE PSYCHIATRIST'S REPORT

This 22 year old, well built, well nourished boy was remanded to Youth House for the first time when he was 17 years old, and of being beyond the control of his mother as well as other persons in his household. This is his first contact with the law.

Lee is a very bright boy who has a real talent for talking about things if and when he is asked to do so. He has the impression that he does not care about others and that he is not bothered and does not have to make any effort for anybody. It was difficult to penetrate the emotional wall behind which he hid, and he provided us with sufficient clues, permitting us to see his self-concept, his self-esteem, feelings of inadequacy and insecurity as the main reasons for his withdrawal, his isolation and solitary habits. Lee told us: "I don't want a friend and I don't like to talk to people." He describes himself as stubborn and according to his own showing likes to say "no." Strongly reactive and negativistic features were present, but psychotic mental content was denied and no indication of psychotic content was observed.

Lee is a boy with superior verbal and cognitive functioning presently on the bright edge of social inefficiency. His abstract thinking capacity and his vocabulary are well developed. He reads and is able to comprehend in spite of his social withdrawal. Lee shows his interest in reading magazines and looking at the pictures in them. He declines to play with others or to take the learning of a subject. He would need special help. The discrepancy between these claims and his actual functioning reveal that the low degree of self-valuation and self-esteem at which this boy is operating is mainly due to feelings of general inadequacy and social inefficiency.

Lee's father died before he was born. The older brother, who is 27, is in the United States Army and the mother supports herself and Lee. This situation makes it inevitable for her to provide Lee with a certain amount of attention. Lee is intensely aware of the fact that this is the only way in which he can get his mother's attention.
