Given the information we now have of the history of CE 399, "the sloucher bullet," there are <sup>two</sup> evidence samples bearing the same exhibit number, CE 842.

One of these samples consisting of 3 fragments, allegedly surgically removed from Connally's wrist, was received in Dr. Guinn's laboratory for Neutron testing. The larger of these pieces, Posner states in his memo to you, without proof, is pictured in WCE 17, page 844.

Okay, but to continue with the evidence: What happened to the evidence sample CE 842 that was tested in 1964 at Oak Ridge for the FBI. It is not in the National Archives. It is "missing." It has to be somewhere Dr. Guinn testified at his HSCOH hearing. Neutron analysis does not destroy the tested object.

We are back to square one. Neither computers nor other technologies can help. The "single bullet theory" remains a "scenario" (p. 418)
