(WASHINGTON) -- THE AUTHOR OF SEVERAL BOOKS CRITICIZING THE OFFICIAL INVESTIGATION OF THE 1963 ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN KENNEDY SAYS HE HAS EVIDENCE THAT THE WARREN COMMISSION PRE-JUDGED THE CASE. AND AUTHOR HAROLD WEISBERG IS CALLING FOR A "FULL, IMPARTIAL AND OPEN INVESTIGATION" OF THE ASSASSINATION.

IN HIS NEW BOOK -- "POST MORTEM" -- WEISBERG CLAIMS THAT A PROPOSED REPORT OUTLINE SUBMITTED TO THE COMMISSION, HEADED BY THEN-CHIEF JUSTICE EARL WARREN, INCLUDED THE ASSUMPTION THAT LEE HARVEY OSWALD WAS THE LONE ASSASSIN. AND THAT WAS THE CONCLUSION REACHED IN THE COMMISSION'S FINAL REPORT. WEISBERG SAYS THE OUTLINE WAS SUBMITTED BEFORE THE COMMISSION BEGAN ITS INVESTIGATION.

WEISBERG ALSO SAID ONE OF THE DOCTORS WHO PARTICIPATED IN THE AUTOPSY OF KENNEDY BURIED HIS NOTES AND A PRELIMINARY DRAFT OF THE AUTOPSY REPORT.
