We have reviewed the attached memorandum of 9-28-64 to the Acting Attorney General Katzenbach from Treasury Secretary Douglas Dillon and its enclosures consisting of Secret Service Planning Document of 8-27-64 and a copy of Dillon's letter of 8-31-64 transmitting it to the Bureau of the Budget. On 9-28-64 Katzenbach asked us to look over this material and flag any items appearing questionable on their face in anticipation of a meeting of the President's Committee relative to the implementation of the Warren Commission recommendation, to be held 11 a.m., 9-29-64.

On enclosed memorandum Belmont to Tolson dated 9-28-64 reporting Katzenbach's request the Director noted: "O.K. I want to indicate we must be relieved of furnishing Agent personnel as our own burdens have more than tripled." II

The Secret Service document is captioned "Plan to Meet Requirements for Expanded Protection of the President and the Vice President of the United States." It provides for additional manpower (totaling 205 Agents, 5 technicians and 50 clerks), additional equipment, research and other support; will take about twenty months to implement; and will require expenditure of approximately \$3,000,000 during that period.

Secret Service points out that while it has made changes in procedure and reorganized some internal operations since the assassination of President Kennedy, it believes these are not enough and that it is vital to take immediate action to improve its capabilities and performance in a number of areas. It states that expansion of facilities in the Protective Research Section (PRS) will require additional manpower; to insure technical security of locations used by the President; make surveys in advance of Presidential trips; provide 24-hour coverage in PRS; design an automated records system in PRS; and create a group of 5 Agents
