Book Review

There has been much recent lively news on the Warren Report covering the investigation of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

Dell Publishing Company, 750 Third Avenue New York, has published White Wash, a paper back (95¢) book by Harold Wiesberg. The book is attracting much attention. Recent developments starting February 20 in New Orleans by the State's Attorney and others seeming to associate several persons with the assassination, increases the importance of reading this book.

Wiesberg was 14 months putting this book together. There are 16 pages of photographs. He infers that publishers were afraid to publish his real true story (his book). 63 book publishers looked at this manuscript before it was selected for wide publication.

Wiesberg is a Marylander living in Hyattstown in Montgomery County near Washington. He has been a pioneer in many activities and has proven to be a fearless thinker, speaker and author for many years. He finally had to print the book himself. Then Dell chose it for publication.

Mr. Wiesberg starts off by attempting to analyze the Warren

Report exclusively on the basis of the Commission's own information.

As this book is read one gains a many new approaches to a problem to which there may be many answers, or no answer at all.

Mr. Wiesberg does a pretty convincing job of proving the Warren Report was not a complete report.

The book has an excellent index. This is not a book that one will read quickly. The 346 pages are easy reading but this is a documentary and goes well with the copy of the Warren Report, and other books disputing the Warren Assassination Report
