In Reports to Warren Commission

Probe Critic Sees a 'Coverup'

By RAYMOND MERLE

Harold Weisberg, a critic of the Warren Commission report on the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, charged here Monday that commission members "were fed pre-digested pabulum" by the Secret Service and FBI.

The author of "Whitewash—the Report on the Warren Report" said his purpose was not to find fault with commission members, whom he lauded for their work, but said "we want the truth."

"When we have anything to do with the assassination of a President, we are going right to the guts of society," Weisberg declared, in an interview describing the commission report as a "monstrous miscarriage."

Second Book Out

Weisberg said his first book showed that there was a "whitewash," and his second, "Whitewash II- the FBI-Secret Service Coverup," which first appeared last week, is an updating of the first and shows that "there are some things beyond question."

He gave a lecture at the Wisconsin Union theater Monday night.

Weisberg had both books published by himself because he said publishers "were afraid" of them. The second, he said, is almost entirely based on the files in the National Archives.

"Too many materials are not available. I would say about one-third approximately are still secret. Responsible for covering up the files are the FBI and Secret Service," Weisberg declared.

"The question is how consequential some of these reports are. You have a question of se-
