Q. Several English publications have identified Ed Proctor as the CIA's new station chief in London. Why do they reveal the identities of our intelligence agents?—M.P., Washington, D.C. A. Some British journalists resent the fact that American intelligence agents are stationed in England. They regard that as an infringement on their sovereignty. Others cannot understand why American intelligence agents should gather information on an ally. Still others object to CIA covert operations in Britain, strongly resent the allegation that British intelligence and security are not as good as American.
