

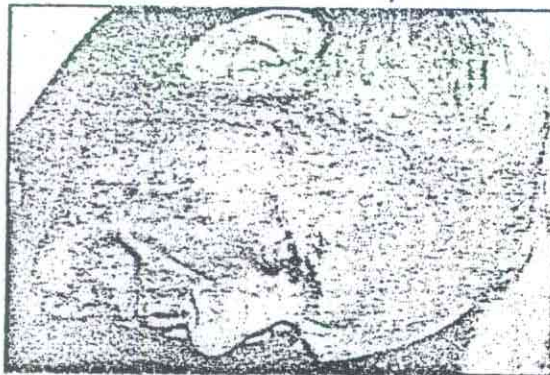
JFK's Murder, Ex-Agent Claims

A former agent for the super secret Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) claims he can prove that Lee Harvey Oswald was set up to take the blame in the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

"There are so many holes in the Warren Commission Report that no thinking person could accept Oswald as JFK's killer," one-time CIA liaison officer L. Fletcher Prouty told INSIDER.

Prouty contends that Oswald never shot anyone.

Conspirators within the CIA set up Oswald to take the blame for Kennedy's assassination, Prouty claims.

He declares that Oswald was "the right man in the right place — an almost perfect patsy."

AS PROOF, Prouty submits a computer-read diagram of the Kennedy motorcade. He contends that this diagram proves beyond a doubt that Oswald could not have fired the shots that killed the President.

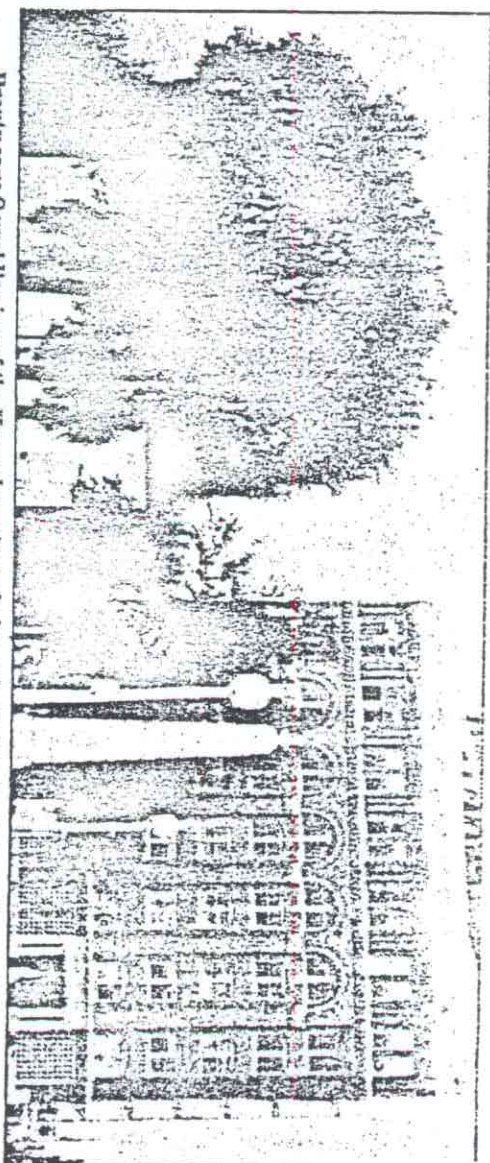
By matching his totally accurate diagram with timed photographs of the assassination, Prouty said he can show that a huge tree in full leaf totally blocked any view of the motorcade from the upper floors of the building from which Oswald is

said to have fired the shots that killed Kennedy.

"There is no way anyone could have seen Kennedy through those branches and leaves, much less shoot him from that area in which the Warren Commission placed Oswald," Prouty said.

PROUTY SAID also that the FBI has admitted reversing frames of a film of the assassination, making it appear that the President's head jumped forward when he was shot. In fact, Prouty said, the President's

head jerked backward, a sure sign the bullets that killed him were fired from in front of the motorcade.

The one-time CIA agent said also that a Dallas policeman was "probably" one of the triggermen in a giant conspiracy.

Prouty believes that the conspiracy included the planting of information about Oswald with the news media to establish him as the assassin.

Prouty is now working with the Washington-based "Committee to Investigate Assassination," a volunteer group that is working to prove that a conspiracy was involved in the assassinations of President Kennedy, Sen. Robert F. Kennedy and Black leader Martin Luther King Jr.

AS A CIA operative, Prouty says he had at one time working relationships with Watergate conspirators G. Gordon Liddy, E. Howard Hunt and James McCord. He claims also to have worked with Edward Lansdale, Gary Powers and other CIA figures.

Prouty claims as well that the

assassination of Robert Kennedy may not be "the classic closed case someone wants us to believe."

Speaking in Washington, Prouty said, "The photos show Sirhan in front of Bobby, yet unreleased autopsy reports indicate that at least one potentially fatal shot was fired into Kennedy's back at close enough range to make deep powder burns in his jacket. Was there a back-up gunman to make sure, and who was he?"

Prouty describes what he calls a "secret team" within the CIA.

"I KNOW WHAT some of these people believe in and it is very frightening what is being done to corrupt our freedoms," he said. He describes the secret team as "chameleon-like professionals who change cover lies as easily as they change jobs and roles within government, industrial and military assignments."

According to Prouty agents of the secret team are planted in the upper echelons of the CIA, FBI, National Security Council, Pentagon, White House and "in the great national and international corporations."

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
