## Kennedy Plot — A Study of Film

A former Pentagon official and a photographic analyst presented yesterday what they said was evidence of a conspiracy to kill President John F. Kennedy in Dallas in 1963.

Colonel L. Fletcher Prouty, a former Pentagon liaison officer with the Central Intelligence Agency, and Richard Sprague said at a news conference they based their presentation on a study in which 25,000 frames of still and motion picture film taken at the scene were examined. They said the Warren Commission examined five per cent of this material and the FBI ten per cent.

The Warren Commission concluded that Lee Harvey Oswald, acting alone, fired three shots from the Texas School Book Depository's sixth-floor window two of which hit the president from behind.

But Sprague said the photographic evidence led him to conclude that:

- "Five minimally, perhaps six shots were fired."
- "There were at least three firing positions, more like four."
- "No one fired any shots from the window."
- "Lee Harvey Oswald fired no shots."

Prouty and Sprague claimed Oswald was framed.
