Dear Senator Proxmire,

Due to my work in communication at Old Stevens Point, I have become concerned and interested in the events and circumstances surrounding the assassination of John F. Kennedy. At the time of the assassination, I was 10 years old, and I was just too young to really grasp all the implications of this terrible act that probably changed the course of history very significantly. I also feel the nation at large was unable to grasp the full implications of the murder at that time, largely due to the great cover-up by the Warren Commission.

In my reading I have become convinced there was a cover up and that an innocent man, Lee Harvey Oswald was framed. The books that lead me to these conclusions are those written by Harold Weisberg and Howard Roffmann, among others. These people are responsible critics. They deal with the facts and don't engage in useless and possibly slander and speculation. The facts ~~and~~ ^{that} show that the Warren Commission and its investigative arm, the FBI, distorted evidence and testimony on the one hand, and passed over evidence and

testimony on the other

The real question (that even

Thank you for letting me know of your concern over the Kennedy assassination investigation and your desire to know more.


The new Senate Committee on Intelligence Activities, of which Senator Frank Church is Chairman, will be conducting a preliminary staff level investigation on this matter. Should the committee findings warrant, further investigations will be held.

You may also be interested to know that Congressman Gonzales of Texas has introduced a resolution in the House of Representatives to establish a Select Committee to investigate not only President Kennedy's assassination but also the assassinations of Robert Kennedy and Martin Luther King, and the attempted assassination of Governor George Wallace. Should such a committee be established, I will certainly closely follow its hearings and recommendations.

I appreciated receiving your views on this controversial issue.
