The popular author-illustrator of children's books has had a busy fall season autographing books in major cities across the country.

HAROLD WEISBERG, whose privately printed book on the Warren Commission Report, "Whitewash," was one of the very first on the subject, has just published on his own "Whitewash II: The FBI-Secret Service Coverup." First printing of the new paperback is 10,000 copies, and Mr. Weisberg tells us that within 48 hours of his notifying the wholesalers handling the first book about the new one, 25% of those 10,000 were ordered by phone. Price of "Whitewash II" is \$4.95, and orders may be placed with Mr. Weisberg in Hyattstown, Md. 20734; phone numbers, 301-WA 6-2034; TR 4-4246.

It is Mr. Weisberg's contention in his new book that the entire reconstruction of the assassination of President Kennedy was wrong and that the "whitewash" which he believes occurred was a function of government on the operating level. He names the names of those he believes were responsible and includes 13 halftones and 11 line cuts which he says help prove that the President was shot before the Warren Commission says he was. Mr. Weisberg further claims that the files of the President's autopsy were "gutted" and do not exist in the National Archives. His material, he says is drawn from the files of the Warren Commission itself. Mr. Weisberg will be making coast-to-coast speaking engagements about his new book.

Meanwhile, Dell rushed through for December 5 release a paperback reprint of the first Weisberg book, "Whitewash: The Report on the Warren Report."

ROBERT CREELEY AND MAY SWENSON will each have a new collection of poetry coming from Scribners in the spring. Mr. Creeley's book will be titled "Words." He is also the author of another poetry collection, "For Love"; a novel, "The Island"; and a book of short stories, "The Gold Diggers." He has received a Rockefeller Foundation grant, a Guggenheim Fellowship and a D.H. Lawrence Fellowship from the University of New Mexico.

"Half Sun Half Sleep" is the title of May Swenson's new book of poetry. She has been working, until recently, in the theater on a Ford Foundation grant and "The Floor," her one-act play was produced in New York. Previous collections of her work include "To Mix with Time and Other Poems" and "Poems to Solve," a juvenile book which has just been published (see Forecast of Children's Books, November 28).
