A few months ago your magazine printed a review of a new book by author John Newman. Its title was "Oswald and the CIA" and it was cited because it is a book "of unusual interest and merit."

This prompts me to write you and ask why there has been no review of two books on the JFK assassination, by author Harold Weisberg. The first of these which came out last year was "Case Open" which was a reply to Posner's, "Case Closed". The second of these was Weisberg's, "Never Again," published this Spring, 1995.

I believe both of these works by Weisberg definitely merit recognition as works "of unusual interest and merit" & I fail to see why they were not reviewed. Can you explain this obvious oversight?
