Quiroga was a member of the Democratic Revolutionary Council founded by Ai-cacha. The anti-Castro organi-zation closed its offices here early in 1962.

Arcacha, now fighting extra-dition from Texas, was accused by Garrison of having conspired with Gordon Novel and the late David W. Ferrie to burglarize a munitions bunker at Houma in August 1961.

Garrison has charged that Ferrie, Lee Harvey Oswald and Caly Shaw, 54-year-old retired executive, conspired here in September 1963 to kill Kennedy.

Novel, 29-year-old former New Orleans bar owner, also has been resisting extradition on the burglary charge. Another set of extradition papers was sent to Columbus, Ohio, on Mon-day after the office of Gov. John McKeithen received them from Garrison.

The first extradition papers, filed about a month ago, were rejected by Gov. James Rhodes of Ohio who claimed there were technical errors.

Rhodes also wanted to know if a federal crime was involved in the charge of burglary conspira-

Then in a followup letter April 24. Rhodes asked for assurances that Garrison did not plan to question Novel about the assassination.

Garrison said such a demand was incredible.
