This is to advise that at 9:30 p.m., 11/22/63, an individual who identified himself as KEN ELLLOTT of radio station WNOE, New Orleans, telephonically advised the following information:

He said he was formerly program director at this station but was now a staff announcer.

He said that for whatever it was worth, he desired to furnish the following information in view of the assassination of the President. He said he had learned from an unrecalled source that General WALKER of Dallas, Texas, has been visiting in the New Orleans area in the past few days and that General WALKER as a close associate of a former WNOE radio announcer, CHARLES RAY. He said that CHARLES RAY is now employed at radio station WILX and that RAY is considered by him to be a rabid segregationist and also an advocate of GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL. He said he "had heard" from an unrecalled source that ROCKWELL was supposed to be in the New Orleans area in the last few days.

ELLIOTT said that he had absolutely no information that WALKER, RAY or ROCKWELL was in any manner involved in the assassination of the President but that he felt the FBI might desire the above information.
