Sen. Alfonse D'Amato said yes-terday that the Senate Banking Committee should place Clinton administration officials under oath to testify about a briefing given to top White House officials on the Whitewater real estate affair.

D'Amato, the panel's ranking Republican, said sworn testimony is needed because administration officials have provided "a fairy tale version" of the briefing by Deputy Treasury Secretary Roger Altman. Altman disclosed last week that he gave the White House counsel and other senior officials a "heads up" on the Resolution Trust Corp.'s Whitewater investigation. Altman, who is acting head of the RTC, said the briefing was limited to procedural matters.
