COPY OF DOCUMENT
TO ATTORNEY

I, DAVID J. ARNDT, being duly sworn, hereby depose and say
as follows:

1. I am an attorney at law and am the attorney
assigned to prepare the defense of the within action. I am,
therefore, fully familiar with the files of the Department of
Justice relating to this matter.

2. On May 6, 1970 my attorney friend wrote to plaintiff's
counsel advising him that plaintiff would be granted amnesty to
which he had been granted by the United States trial the Court in
Michigan in June-July, 1968 in the extradition proceeding by
which James Earl Ray, the convicted killer of Dr. Martin Luther
King, was released to this country. A true copy of this letter
is attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and is my best recollection.

3. On May 22, 1970 plaintiff and his attorney
submitted documents relating to the phase of the case, and submitted
documents to the Clerk of the Circuit Court of the State of
Michigan.
