## James Earl Ray Seeking **Executive Clemency Hearing**

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — James Earl Ray, on victed assassin of the Rev. Martin Luther King, is seeking executive clemency apart of a continuing effort to be freed from his 99-year prison sentence.

In a letter last month to the state Board of Pardon

In a letter last month to the state Board of Pardon and Paroles, Ray asked for an application to obtain an executive elemency hearing. The board recommends liemency candidates to the governor.

"Without going into details at this time, if the loard grants me a hearing, I will attempt to present to the board exculpatory evidence and related matter, including those responsible for financing the MLK lomicide," Ray said in his letter.

Ray, 52, is confined at Brushy Mountain State Prison in Petros, Tenn. Since being sentenced on March II, 1968, he has escaped once and is reported to have made at least three other attempts to break out.

Ray plead guilty of the April 4, 1968, killing, but sater recanted his plea, saying it had been coerced.
