**Capitol Bomb
Probe Again
Under Way**

A federal grand jury in Detroit resumed investigation of the March 1 bombing of the Capitol yesterday, calling war activist Jane Silverman to testify.

In San Francisco, anti-war protesters have announced plans for a mass march at the Republican National Convention in San Diego next summer.

Writing out a letter, he said Abbie Hoffman, leader of the Youth International Party (YIP), gave him the falls for the protest.

Miss Silverman, 30, a veteran worker in the peace movement, indicated she would testify if she were subpoenaed. She said she has no contact with the underground movement.

The grand jury is investigating the bombing of the Capitol building in Washington, D.C., on March 1, 1971.

Now, Silverman was subpoenaed in the current phase of the underground search for the bomb.

She could not be reached in Detroit for comment on the subpoena. The grand jury has not yet heard from her.

A self-styled "psychedelic anarchist" who participated with the 1968 day demonstrations here and calling themselves the "Psychedelic Scapegoat" also have refused to testify.

Five filed a suit in June to block their appearance, claiming among other things that information leading to their subpoenas stemmed from illegal government wiretaps. Hearings on the suits have not been completed.

Three of the suits were filed by Kelly, a Detroit lawyer; Tauber, of Detroit; and Michael, of Chapel Hill, N.C. The court issued new subpoenas Monday in San Francisco and they currently are being served.

At the same conference in which Hoffman announced the San Diego protest, the three vowed not to cooperate with the Detroit grand jury and burned what they said were their subpoenas.
