## Police Indicted in L.A. Shooting

LOS ANGELES, March 3 (UPI)-Four policemen were indicted here today for violating civil rights in the so-called 'mistake shooting" deaths of two Mexican nationals last summer.

In addition, a federal grand tury indicted two policemen ind a civilian for plotting to urglarize a woman's home ind another officer with foreng a female suspect to disohe in his patrol car.

In the shootings last sumner, police had contended that a series of mistakes compounded by the fact that none of the men in an apartment raided by officers spoke English-led to the deaths of the two Mexicans. Manslaughter charges against the officers were later dismissed.
