At that time Special Agent Hesty related to this officer that the Subject was a member of the Communist Party, and that he was residing in Dallas.

The Subject was arrested for the marder of Officer J.D. Tippit and is a prime suspect in the assassination of President Hennedy.

The information regarding the Subject's affiliation with the Communist Party is the first information this officer has received from the Federal Bureau of Investigation regarding same.

Agent Hosty further stated that the Federal Bureau of Investigation was seare of the Subject and that they had information that this Subject was espable of essentiting the assassmention of President Kennedy.

One of the more descinating parts of this 11/22/65 report, later sworm to, is the wrong ad dress given for Osveld, his earlier address. This certainly does indicate Dollas Police knowledge of LHO and adds point to the unenswered %C staff questions I have in other documents, how did the police know to go to 1026 Beckley? Is there meaning in Bosty's having told Revill LHO was a "member of the Communist Party", which was known to be false, if he did? Hosty knew this was not Cawald's address, therefore he was not likely Revill's source. This letter was written before Csweld was charged with killing Tippit. It does not say that the word was Hosty was the firt word on IHO, only that it was from the FHI. However, from its agents in the AMLU, it would not have gotten this address for LHO, would have connected him with Michael Pains.
