November 22, 1963

Rifle discovered in southwest corner of sixth floor, Texas School Book Depository, Dallas, Texas, by Deputy Sheriff 8. Boone, Dallas County Sheriff's Office, who called rifle to attention of Deputy Constable Seymour Weitzman, Dallas County Constable's Office. Possession of rifle assumed by Captain Will Fritz and Lieutenant J. Carl Day of the Dallas Police Department.

Assassination of President Kennedy had the assassination rifle tested by Ronald S. Simmons, Chief, Infantry Weapons Evaluation Branch, Bullistic Research Laboratory, Department of ithe Army, Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland, during the period March 17, 1964 to March 30, 1964, but the date received by Simmons and the date returned to the President's Commission is unknown and is not reflected in Simmons' testimony before the President's Commission. Furthermore, it is pointed out that the President's Commission had the assassination rifle tested by Dr. Alfred G. Olivier, Supervisory Research Veterinarian, Department of the Army, Edgewood Arsenal, Maryland, but the pertinent dates are unknown and are not reflected in the testimony before the President's Commission.
