U.S. Seizes Head Of Anti-Castro Nationalist Unit

MIAMI, May 12 (AP)—The head of a militant anti-Castro organization, which had warned of possible sabotage at the Cuban pavilion in Montreal's Expo 67, was arrested tonight by the U.S. immigration authorities.

The exile, Felipe Rivero, director of the Cuban Nationalist Association, was lodged in Dade County Jail. Authorities refused to say why Rivero was arrested.

Authorities revoked the 43year-old Bay of Pigs invasion veteran's parole as a refugee. This means he is no longer admissible in the United States, but officials said Rivero's status will be reviewed.
