Book Challenging Manchester Facts Starts on Tuesday

"The Truth About the Assassination," by Charles Roberts, which challenge points made by William Manchester in his book, "The Death of a President," starts Tuesday in the Record American.

A serialization, in six installments, of Roberts' fascinating book will conclude in the Sunday Advertiser of April 2.
