Dear Mr. Roberts,

Your letter of May 8 is not responsive to mine of the fourth.

For the record I note your nasty insinuations, more subtle than your paid for falsehood, that SHUTTERMAN came from "sources" other than myself and that it has "egregious misjudgments". You had an opportunity in your book to prove the latter and you made no attempt to, for you cannot. You have a standing opportunity to do it to my face and you do not. I ask this I add the challenge that you stipulate what even your McCarthyite mind can twist into a justification for the words "from the same sources who led you into such egregious misjudgments in 'Whitewash'".
