As I said they have changed as I learn more about the case. I have had to change my positioning of one of the fractures because I found out I was looking at a right rather than a left lateral view in the photographs I had before I went into the National Archives and saw the orioginals which included both lateral views.

I hope you don't mind but I am sending you a copy of a letter I was going to send Harold Weisberg. After talking to him on the phone he said he would not have time enough to devote to it. I have no regular secretary and I investedconsiderable time typing the letter. It is a pretty thorough account of my thoughts on the case of the head wounds. I hope you find it informative.
