Dear Harold and Dick,

Please excuse the delay in answering your recent letters. I have been unbelievably busy and quite unfortunately answer as I am used to doing. I still read all your letters and maintain the same interest, but am inhibited in the responses I can make. Now that I have a few minutes, I'll go through all the unanswered mail and respond to what is necessary, adding new things.

First, I got a new 399 base pic from A in accordance with my latest request for exact duplication of Harold's. It looks like it is that. The shadows appear same. Focus may be very slightly not as good, but good enough. Don't have my others here to compare but will get them in a week. After comparing, will send to Dick.

One of the boys in my dorm is from Dallas and was at Love Field on the day of the assassination. There he shook JFK and LBJ hands. His father drove through Dealey plaza 10 minutes before the shots and, on Sunday, participated in the operations on Oswald. I have never heard his name mentioned before--Weiner. I asked if he knew of pix or took any, etc. He knows of no contemporaneous ones in plaza though he took some of chalk marks on the ground two or three days after. His friend got a poor movie of the plane landing. It was quite interesting talking to him, especially to learn of the various moods in Dallas.

My first lecture will be next Tuesday. I expect a good response.

For Harold, I am enclosing the minutemen book by Harry Jones. The book is now revised and called "A Private Army."

The thing with Paul is very disturbing, for I had always expected more of him from what I had heard. I didn't think he would respond to your criticism as so many have. People, those who can accept truth or constructive criticism, generally want it sweetened up so it doesn't taste quite so bad. I support you in "telling it like it is" for I think that type of jolt is necessary and (potentially) constructive. Unfortunately, not enough people can or will accept this.
