FORMER attorney for slain mobster John Roselli said yesterday he told the FBI as early as 1967 of Roselli's belief that Cuban Premier Fidel Castro ordered President John Kennedy assassinated in retaliation for alleged CIA attempts against Mr. Castro's life.

Roselli was one of the underworld figures the CIA recruited to try to kill Mr. Castro.

he asked columnist Drew
Pearson in January 1967
to tell Chief Justice Earl
Warren of Roselli's fears.

'Blind memo'

The Senate Intelli-The Senate Intelli-gence Committee last June released an FBI "bilind memorandum" with its report on the part the intelligence community played in the Kennedy assassina-tion investigation.

The memo, dated March 21, 1967, was of an interview with the FBI in which the Cuban connection was report-

Although the interviewee was not identified in the committee report, Mr. Morgan

fied in the committee report, Mr. Morgan acknowledged to a reporter that he had made the statements.

Mr. Morgan said he had learned from Roselli that "during the last CIA-backed attempt on Mr. Castro's life." the would-be assassin "was caught and was assassinated and confessed the whole story to Mr. Castro about the CIA plot to kill him." plot to kill him."

"Castro's reaction was that if that's the way the Americans played the game, we can play the same game, indi-cating a purpose on his part to retailate against Kennedy," Mr. Morgan added.

Contacts

Mr. Morgan said he could not recall the exact date of the final attempt on Premier Castro's life, but he believed it was in 1962 or 1963.

Mr. Morgania Roselli's information came from contacts close to Mr. Castro who were involved in the assassination attempts Morgan said information

Chief Justice Warren did not discuss with Mr. Morgan the allegations he made through, Mr. Pearson The allegations were reported to the FBI which eventually questioned Mr. Morgan.

Neither the Warren Commission nor any other government agency has concluded that Mr. Castro actually was involved in President Kennedy's death.

Roselli's body was found stuffed in a chainwraped oil drum in Biscayne Bay near Miami, on Aug. 7, ten days after he disappeared.—AP.
