Gangster Reported Missing A Week From Fla. Home

John Roselli, an underworld figure reputedly recruited by the CIA in the 1960s plot to assassinate Cuban Premier Fidel Castro, has been missing for one week from his Plantation, Fla., home, investigative reporter Jack Anderson said yesterday.

Anderson, in a report on ABC-TV, said Roselli borrowed his sister's car July 28, stowed his golf clubs in the trunk, and has not been seen since. The car was found in a parking garage at Miami Airport, and the FBI is investigating, Anderson said.

The FBI said in Miami yesterday it does not know where Roselli is but is making inquiries to see if any federal violation has occurred.

Roselli told the Senate intelligence committee that he had participated in

six assassination attempts against Castro in the early 1960s.

He reportedly was associated with Chicago gangster Sam Giancana, also allegedly involved in the Castro plot. Giancana's murder a year ago has not been solved.
