

Rosenberg Witnesses Collaborated?

LOS ANGELES — FBI documents tell of a meeting of the chief prosecution witnesses against Julius and Ethel Rosenberg at which they resolved discrepancies in their stories presented at the couple's espionage trial, The Los Angeles Times reported today.

According to the documents — part of 8,000 pages of FBI files released last week to the Rosenbergs' sons, Robert and Michael Meeropol — prosecution witnesses Harry Gold and David Greenglass had initially told investigators differing stories about a meeting in Albuquerque, N.M., to obtain atom bomb secrets.

The FBI document describes a meeting of Gold, Greenglass and FBI investigators at the Tombs prison in New York on Dec. 28, 1950.
