Dear Lou,

This may be quite important, so I write when I can, before daylight, onathe basis of incomplete information. I made three telephone attempts yesterday to get more information, but the party to whom I must speak was not evailable.

I have in my possession, coming to me indirectly from Dallas, these documents from your files:

Sep 1 67 franked envelope, P.O. Box 100, Leevenworth, Kenses, addressed to Bill Martin;

3.23.67 typed, 3-page letter signed with the slies Don Morgan (which several of us believe is an alias of Dave Broman);, about Nagell, with "copies to file, Ramparts and Mark Lane" (underlined as "im is wont to do);

Handwritten, 1-page letter signed by Nagell, to Martin, dated April 13,1967. with several added handwritten notations;

Similar envelope address to Martin by Negell, dated April 17, 1967 et Springfield, Mo., by cancellation, with added notations (2);

Retyped letter headed "Letter from Richard Case Nagell to Benator Richard Russell January 3, 1968...(did not xerox well)", with added notations (these notations may be in Jartin's handwriting);

Two-page memo from Martin on Magell case, top missing, was on legal paper, this copy letter-sized Xerox, recounting his 4/19/67 conversation with Dr. Cicone, Director of the Medical Center for Federal Prisoners;

Ditto, single page of three short paragraphs, beginning, "on the morning of April 25, 1967, I had a rather lengthy meeting with a clinical psychiatrist in this city" for help in composing a letter to Nagell:

I am aware of the mossibility that subsequent to the trip to Dollas I made with your knowledge you may have assented to this being given to someone there. I am also aware that Boxley had been in contact with the person I went to see before I was there (as well as after, if you didn t know that) and he may have been authorized to give copies of this file to someone. It is my impression that this is far from your complete Nagell file. I have a continuing good relationship with this man in Dallas. I have also introduced a friend to him and they get along very well. Everything may be in order, but because of the possibility this is far from what was delivered and that it might not have been authorized, I tell you about it. Inhere every confidence the person from whom this came would not use this file against your interest. I will continue my efforst to learn more. If there is anything special you'd like me to do, let me know.

A second matter is important to me and Gary Tchcener. About the time of one of my trips to New Orleans he mailed me an only copy of work that had been done comparing hornley's testimony with his printed version. There were extensive changes in it. Neither he nor I can find this. It may be important to you also

that we complete this work. Therefore, would you please have the Thornley and any other appropriate files checked to see if inadvertently it was opened as office mail and place in the file? There were amout 20 typed pages. It was a rough draft. It was not by Schoener but was done for him, at his request, by another person.

Referring to the Negell file egain, I cannot copy this and send it to you because, as you know, I am not in a position to use my better copier and the quality of what I have precludes the possibility I could make meaningful copies on the old Thermofax, which is working. Indications are that it is one of a series of generations of Xaroxes.

In answer to your letter of March 27 I have determined that according to the material attached which mentions Don Morgan, he and David Kroman may possibly be the same.

A confidential source advises that he thinks the two men are one and the same. Another source who was in New Orleans and who had an opportunity to talk with Jaffe said that Jaffe told her that Kroman and Morgan were identical. This information came about during the Shaw trial.

Our first source asked that he not be identified for two reasons. One, he is not certain of the validity of his statement and two, it is necessary to protect his identity.

As I uncover additional information which may be of value to you, I will pass it on.
