**Ruby's Doctors
Asked If He Can
Take Lie Test**

AUSTIN, Tex., Dec. 28 (AP) — The Department of Public Safety Director asked Jack Ruby's doctors today to decide whether Ruby is able to take a polygraph examination, commonly called a lie-detector test.

The test was requested by Attorney General Waggoner Carr Dec. 22, and Ruby has said he wants one.

Ruby was convicted in 1964 of killing Lee Harvey Oswald, identified by the Warren Commission as the assassin of President Kennedy, but a new trial has been ordered.

This month, doctors found that Ruby is suffering from cancer.
