2d Ruby Will Probate Judge
Thomas C. Murphy said a second, unsigned will takes precedence over one hand-written in 1949 by Jack Ruby, killer of accused presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald.

Jack wanted to sign the will but couldn't because a deputy sheriff refused to witness it, Ruby's brother Earl

said. The family decided to wait until morning and have the doctor witness it, Earl Ruby said, but Jack Ruby

went into a coma.

The will divides the estate equally among the brothers and sisters and contains a death-bed statement denying any conspiracy in the Kennedy assassination.
