

## Ruby Autopsy

DALLAS, Tex.—An autopsy report disclosed that

Jack Ruby, who died of complications from cancer Jan. 3, also had eight small brain tumors, the largest the size of a thumbnail. County Medical Examiner Earl Rose said, however, that it was highly unlikely they were there in 1963 when Ruby killed Lee Harvey Oswald. Rose said doctors found no evidence of epilepsy, as claimed by defense lawyers in his 1964 trial.

In Detroit, Ruby's brother Earl petitioned the Probate Court for a hearing to recover Ruby's belongings, including the pistol used to kill Oswald. Summonses have been issued for District Attorney Henry Wade and Dallas Sheriff Bill Decker to appear in Detroit April 3.
