When confronted with his identification card and a letter addressed to him at the Dallas YMCA, she said he was the roomer, but that she knew his name was "Lee" because she had heard him answer to the name. The complainant was extremely confused. Mr. Rubenstein offered to pay \$50 for the damage, so the three suspects were released.

OF THE CITY OF DALLAS POLICE DEPARTMENT DETAILING A DISTURBING

DALLAS, TEXAS. THE REPORT INDICATED THAT MARY F. BLEDSOE, THE OWNER OF A ROOMING HOUSE AT THAT NORTH MARSALIS ADDRESS, HAD REPORTED A SCUFFLE BETWEEN ONE OF HER TENANTS, LEE OSWELL AND AN INDIVIDUAL IDENTIFIED BY POLICE AS J. R. RUBENSTEIN (TRUE NAME OF JACK RUBY). ACCORDING TO THE POLICE REPORT, THE TENANT IDENTIFIED HIMSELF WITH IDENTIFICATION CARDS AS ALEK HIDELL. WHEN ADVISED OF THE DISCREPANCY IN NAMES, BLEDSOE INDICATED THAT SHE KNEW THAT HER TENANT HAD ANSWERED TO THE NAME LEE. REPORT REFLECTS THAT NO ARRESTS WERE MADE AND THAT MR. RUBENSTEIN OFFERED TO PAY \$50 FOR THE DAMAGES TO THE ROOMING HOUSE. AS REPORTED IN THE ABOVE REFERENCE TELETYPE, VARIOUS AVENUES OF INVESTIGATION WERE SET FORTH BY SA GARY R. GERSZEWSKI AND VISUAL INVESTIGATIVE ANALYST FERRIS L. ROOKSTOOL, DALLAS DIVISION, IN ORDER TO DETERMINE THE AUTHENTICITY/EXISTENCE OF THE GENERAL OFFENSE REPORT.

ON 2/5/92, DURING A MORE DETAILED REVIEW OF THE REPORT, SEVERAL ITEMS OF INTEREST WERE NOTED BY SA GERSZEWSKI AND ROOKSTOOL. IN THE OFFENSE REPORT THERE ARE CATEGORIES SET FORTH FOR BOTH DAY AND DATE OF THE OFFENSE. THE REPORT REFLECTS THAT THE OFFICER RESPONDED ON A THURSDAY. THE DATES INDICATE THAT THE OFFICER RESPONDED IN THE LATE EVENING HOURS

OF 10/11/63, WITH THE REPORT BEING PREPARED ON 10/12/63. A REVIEW OF A 1963 CALENDAR INDICATES THAT THE DATE 10/11/63 OCCURRED ON A FRIDAY AND NOT A THURSDAY AS INDICATED ON THE REPORT. THIS DISCREPANCY IS OF PARTICULAR NOTE IN THAT THE EVENT REPORTED OCCURRED IN THE LATE EVENING HOURS OF A FRIDAY EXTENDING ON INTO EARLY SATURDAY MORNING.

ADDITIONALLY, SA GERSZEWSKI AND ROOKSTOOL OBSERVED A STRING OF ONE AND TWO DIGIT NUMBERS SEPARATED BY HYPHENS AT THE TOP OF THE REPORT. THESE NUMBERS APPEARED ABOVE THE INFORMATIONAL PORTION OF THE REPORT. IT WAS INITIALLY THOUGHT THAT THEY HAD SOME SIGNIFICANCE FOR RECORD KEEPING PURPOSES. HOWEVER, IT WAS NOTED THAT THE HIGHEST NUMBER IN THE STRING WAS 25. BASED UPON THIS INFORMATION, SA GERSZEWSKI AND ROOKSTOOL APPLIED THE ALPHABET A THROUGH Z TO THEIR CORRESPONDING NUMERICAL COUNTERPARTS 1 THROUGH 26. FROM THAT KEY EACH NUMBER IN THE STRING AT THE TOP OF THE REPORT WAS ASSIGNED AN ALPHABETICAL CHARACTER. THE RESULT WAS A STRING OF LETTERS AS FOLLOWS "ASPHONYASITLOOKS". BY PLACING FOUR SPACES, THE STRING READS AS PHONY AS IT LOOKS.
