Ruby Pistol Going Into The Archives

DETROIT, March 20 (UPI) —Jack Ruby's heirs have agreed to give the pistol with which he killed Lee Harvey Oswald to the National Archives in Washington, it was announced today.

Earl Ruby, brother of Jack and newly named executor of the will, said the National Archives also would be offered the suit and hat Ruby wore when he shot Oswald, killer of President John F. Kennedy.

Alan Adelson, attorney for the estate, said Ruby's three brothers and three sisters had agreed to use Ruby's first will, written in 1950, and drop two later ones including one dictated from his death bed.

Adelson said Ruby's pistol, a snub-nosed Colt revolver, "is worth maybe \$50,000 to a collector."

The National Archives already had agreed to take the pistol and probably the suit and hat.
