Dear Dick,

You also give a false description of it in saying that you got it by "making a photcopy of it along with dozens of other files from the Garrison investigation." This says it is part of the Garrison investigation. That is a lie. No connection of any kind.

You cannot have missed this controlling stipulation in the transcript and you did not in my letter. You just ignore it and try to tell me how important you and your crappy book are - and that licenses you to lack ethics.


