Dear Mr. Weisberg:

In the temporary absence of Senator Russell who is away from Washington for the remainder of this week, I am taking the liberty of acknowledging and thanking you for your letter and enclosed copy of the one to you from the Archivist of the United States on certain aspects of the records of the Warren Commission.

Your correspondence will, of course, be brought to the Senator's attention at the earliest opportunity upon his return, and he now has in his hands your earlier letters and information.

The Senator is most interested in the matters which you raise and will undoubtedly devote more attention to them when it is possible for him to do so. As you may know, the Congress is pressing toward an adjournment date during the first week of August and the various subcommittees of the Senate Appropriations Committee of which Senator Russell is a member are meeting almost daily. Therefore, this and his other duties limit the Senator's time presently but you may be assured that we will be in touch with you if the Senator feels that you can be of further assistance after he has had an opportunity to study the material which you have submitted.
