Thank you for the information in your letter of the 30th.

Ms. Barbehenn had been in touch with some of your people. They referred her to the LBJ Library and from it she is getting a dub of the tape.

Unless there are now documents in the Commission's files that were not there in 1968 much of the significance of that LBJ-Senator Russell conversation will not be perceived. I believe it should be of interest to authentic scholars.


I wrote about it to a limited degree in my 1974 book, Whitewash IV.

There is more in my 1995 NEVER AGAIN!

After writing that I wrote a lengthier account that I make available to scholars and will be part of my records at local Hood College.

My sources were Senator Russell himself, his legislative assistant and records he and Senator John Sherman Cooper left. These make it clear that Senator Cooper agreed with Senator Russell on the impossibility of the basic single-bullet theory and that to a lesser degree Congressman Hale Boggs did, too.

Thank you for the information in your letter of the 30th.

I would like to get a dub of the tape of that 7:54 p.m. conversation
between President Johnson and Senator Russell on 9/18/64.

Not knowing how to address those to whom you refer me I ask that you
please refer this request for that dub to the proper person there. I'll pay
the costs.

Unless there are documents in the Commission's files that ~~were~~^{were} not
there in 1968 the significance of that conversation on that date may not be
apparent to scholars looking to learn rather than validate a point of view.
I wrote about that in my 1974 book Whitewash IV.


Later I wrote about that in greater detail in an unpublished manuscript
That in time will be available at local Hood College. I also include some
in my 1995 NEVER AGAIN! which was published by Carroll & Graf.

Senator Russell was the first critic of the Warren Report, as the news
stories I cite in NEVER AGAIN! do not make clear. Senator Cooper joined him
in that. Senator Russell told me that Congressman Hale Boggs had the same
doubts but not as strongly.

If any scholars inquire about this and would like copies I'll be glad
to provide them.

Dear Mr. Weisberg:

This is in response to your letter of December 16, 1996, requesting information concerning the existence of transcript documenting a conversation between President Johnson and Senator Russell on September 18, 1964.

According to our listing of LBJ transcripts, the conversation between Senator Russell and President Johnson took place at 7:54 p.m. on September 18, 1964. Our notations indicate that the JFK related portion of the conversation was 13 minutes and 51 seconds in length and the two men discussed the Warren Commission Report, Lee Harvey Oswald, and the bullet that struck John Connally. Further checking indicates that there is no transcript of this conversation. Documents supporting this fact are enclosed. Apparently portions of the tape can be heard in our Motion Picture Sound and Video research room. They can provide you with additional information regarding reproduction.

Please let us know if we may be of further assistance.

STATEMENT BY THE STAFF OF THE LBJ LIBRARY

TAPE 64.02, PNO 2

The following is a portion of a conversation between President Johnson and Senator Richard Russell on September 18, 1964, at 7:54 P.M. The entire conversation is approximately twenty-three minutes, forty-five seconds in length and was originally recorded on two Dictabelts. There is no transcript of this conversation, and only that portion of the conversation in which the Kennedy assassination was discussed is included in this tape. This discussion occurs at the beginning of the first Dictabelt recording and is approximately three minutes, ten seconds in length.
