## FIRST HAND KNOWLEDGE HOW I PARTICIPATED IN THE CIA-MAFIA MURDER OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY

After thirty years of silence Robert Morrow admits:

Gus Russo felt the man was ready to talk about the assassination and, based on this assessment, the head of the JFK Assassination Archives in Washington, D.C., attorney Bud Fensterwald was ready to head to Florida and interview him. When I heard of Bud's intention, I told Russo in no uncertain terms that Bud would never be allowed to approach the man and, if Bud attempted to go through with the interview, he would be killed. Russo believed me, but, unfortunately, Bud did not. He laughed it off when I repeated to him the same warning. Bud asked me to set-up a luncheon date with the Colonel for the first or second week in April of 1991. I said I would, but told Bud that, as my phone was tapped, the CIA was well aware of his trip and would, undoubtedly, be aware of his luncheon appointment. Again he laughed and asked if I wanted a bodyguard. I told him it wouldn't help.

I set up the luncheon date for the 11th of April, 1991, with the Colonel, and told Bud. He said he would send me the money for the tickets and meet me at the Palm Beach airport just before noon. Worried, I called Gus again. Gus responded by saying that Bud was convinced that if the man was involved, he would get it out of him. I then reported all this to Doug Sandhage, the publisher of *East Side Weekend*. Just days before I was to meet Bud, I received a call from Bud's secretary that he had died the previous

night. Before I could get an autopsy had been done, I had already called Russo Sandhage and got an article titled "The Kennedy" detailing the FBI's findings.

Shortly after the announcement, I received a call from a producer, who had just received a call from a man who had done another story on the Kennedy assassination. I was in mind taking a part in the first article. Also as part of the investigation, some of my documents were reviewed.

In some ways, the assassination has been perpetuated. There is no one to continue doing the investigation. However, one thing is true.

The people who were involved are the result.
