Next, I believe it is important to make your voices heard as best you can, in letters to your legislators and the White House. One man is a very small percentage of 200,000,000, but if enough individuals express themselves, the total will be noted and perhaps he ded. Whether or not it is heeded, it is the responsibility of all of us.
