You, personally, know the state of my affairs. I have been paying interest on this money and cannot afford to - should not have had to.

Barause, of the time, I seemed to your offer to pay a third shore, if you do this before I speak to the lawyer, I will accept it. However, have no liability in this matter, was not consulted, did not agree, and if have to use the lawyer, I will take the position that none of it is my responsibility. Indeed, none of it is.
