Recently, when I again asked you about refunding your costs in the suit Bringuier filed against you, I asked you to forward this request through channels. When we first spoke of this, you put your publisher on the phone. He then told me that Steve Bair had declined his offer to pay a third of the costs on the ground I was paying all. I have no such agreement with anyone, as I then told you both, and I had no agreement with you on this of any kind.

So, I am again asking for this. From what the lawyer told me, his bill totalled about \$5, 200.00. My own expenses, aside from a large amount of time, were something over \$500.00. This covers both suits.

I leaned over backwards, did what I did not regard as to my personal interest, certainly what I did not want to, not to embarrass either of the other parties. I do not like being had on top of this. Meanwhile, because that money was just physically taken from me, without request or consent, it is one of a number of matters I will have to do something about. I hope, with you people, and with the reasonable and fair attitude your publisher expressed on the phone, and with his honesty, this will not be necessary. ~~xxxxxxx~~

However, I have located a lawyer in New York who seems willing to represent me in a number of matters. When I can I will be going there and discussing these things with him. I do hope this will not have to be one.

You, personally, know the state of my affairs. I have been paying interest on this money and cannot afford to - should not have had to.

Because, at the time, I assented to your offer to pay a third share, if you do this before I speak to the lawyer, I will accept it. However, I have no liability in this matter, was not consulted, did not agree, and if I have to use the lawyer, I will take the position that none of it is my responsibility. Indeed, none of it is.

In your March 1964 issue you carried an article by Bill Turner on Oswald. I'd appreciate a copy, Xerox will do. Also, how about my pictures you have not yet returned? If you do not return them, how about paying me the cost of replacing them?
