The following information is set forth relative to one SPIVER WHITNEY GORDON, also known as Spiever Gordon, Spiver Gordon, Spiver Gordon, and Spiver W. Gordon.

A letter received from New Orleans dated 3/27/68, reflected that this individual had been involved in numerous civil rights and racial matter investigations at New Orleans Division in 1963 through 1967. He was connected with the Black Nationalist Movement and was also connected with the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC). He gives his mailing address of his father, GARFIELD E. GORDON, 723 Harmason Street, Flaquemines, La. A confidential source advised the New Orleans Office that GORDON had been seen in Baton Rouge, La., for several days in February of 1968, and supposedly left on 2/8/68, for Atlanta, Georgia, where he currently resides. He was described as a Negro male, having been born 8/24/39, at Plaquemines, La., 5'8", 200 lbs, having black hair, brown eyes, a heavy build, and a large semi-circular scar over left eye close to hairline. He was known to have had military service in the United States Army under Serial Number

knowledge of SNCC activities in Atlanta, could furnish no information relative to the subject's alleged presence in the City of Atlanta.
